



## How is a Pediatric Psychologist different?

A pediatric psychologist sees children, adolescents, and their parents when there is a medical condition that is driving the need for therapy.

Families come to a pediatric psychologist with primary concerns such as adjustment to new diagnosis, trouble completing medical treatments or taking medicines, mood concerns related to complex medical presentations, and parenting a child with medical complexity.

## What are some examples of an appropriate referral?

- A teen with a new diagnosis of diabetes
- A parent of a new baby in the NICU that needs a space to work through their own feelings
- A child with cystic fibrosis that has started refusing to take enzymes in front of friends
- Parents of a toddler with constipation and a withholding pattern
- A child that won't leave the house because they're afraid of getting sick
- A teen with concerns regarding sexual and reproductive health

We see patients across all subspecialties of pediatric medicine including:  
pulmonology, adolescent medicine, solid organ transplant, gastroenterology, neurology, medical rehabilitation, cardiology, nephrology, endocrine, sleep medicine, and differences of sexual development.

## Pricing
